

Abstract

The State of Wyoming is a fossil hunting paradise. The major geological formations from the Precambrian to the Quaternary age are all visible. Layers of earth from Mesozoic Era reveal dinosaur bones. Sediments from the Tertiary age hold aquatic fossils from ancient oceans continuing up through the recent ice ages revealing remnants of mammoths and even modern man. The extreme Wyoming weather creates constant exposure of formations and changing sediments to reveal new fossils.
